






SHANIVAR MANCH – MONSOON MELA






TRAINING SESSION 2019




SHANIVAR MANCH – GANESH ART


SHANIVAR MANCH – PHOTOGRAPHY WORKSHOP




MAAY MARATHI INAUGURATION


SHANIWAR MANCH- BOLLYWOOD HUNGAMA

The event wrapped up by thanking all those who were present and the participants. The student council is still keeping up with their aim, which is to entertain the students, was proved once again.






CL MEET




VERVE- INAUGURATION

There was a collection of management games to test the business acumen, skills and knowledge within the participants. These events were held in the rooms of X-block campus.





SHANIWAR MANCH – ZUMBA



MEGH MALHAR







Dr. Amartya Lahiri took over the stage and started with the highlight which was on the investment and the outcome of the budget session. Union budget 2019 highlights was tax cut for middle class, and was relief for small farmers. A few numbers are useful to put in perspective the development challenge that India faces today. India’s current gross domestic product (GDP) is around \$2.5 trillion while its GDP per person is \$2,000. With an annual population growth of 1.1 per cent and aggregate GDP growth of 6.6 per cent, India’s per person GDP is currently growing at 5.5 per cent annually. At these growth rates, India’s per person GDP would be around \$19,000 in 2060. Development is a challenge globally, not just in India. The per person GDP of the richest 5 per cent of countries in the world is over 50 times larger than the per person GDP of the poorest 5 per cent. Mr. Sameer Narang spoke on output produced by combining labour of different skill types, land, capital, energy and public infrastructure. Combining these inputs also requires entrepreneurship and management.


REPUBLIC DAY
