

Race to the White House: US Election 2024





The upcoming 2024 presidential election in the United States. The two major political parties: are the Democratic Party and the Republican Party. On the Republican side, previous President Donald Trump. Following President Joe Biden's decision not to run for re-election, Vice President Kamala Harris has entered the race and established herself as a front-runner among Democrats.

The winner of the US presidential election isn't decided by counting everyone's votes across the country. Instead, each state gets a certain number of special votes called "electoral votes" based on its population. There are 538 of these votes in total. To become president, a candidate needs to win at least 270 of these electoral votes. This means candidates focus on winning states, not just individual votes because winning a state means getting all of that state's electoral votes. So, even if one candidate gets more votes overall, the one who wins the key states with more electoral votes can still become president.

The Republican Party advocates for lower taxes, limited government intervention, strict immigration, and abortion policies, whereas the Democratic Party advocates for civil rights, social welfare, and climate action. In addition to determining the next White House occupant, the outcome of the 2024 election will also determine key policy directions for the coming years.

Indian Railways to resolve lengthy waiting lists by 2022–2031



In a recent declaration, Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw welcomed in a new era for Indian railway travel. Speaking to the country, Vaishnaw announced plans to end the long-standing problem of train waiting lists and guarantee that each passenger has a confirmed berth. The Ministry wants to close the gap between the supply and demand for seats that are reserved. The railway infrastructure will be modernised as part of this project to boost train service efficiency and capacity.

Indian Railways transports over 700 crore passengers a year on 10,754 train trips every day. It is projected that the number will increase to 1,000 crore passengers by 2030. To eliminate the list, the national transporter intends to add 3,000 more train journeys. To increase passenger comfort even more, Indian Railways plans to create a comprehensive "super app" that will include some services, including train tracking and ticketing. As instructed by PM Modi, the ministry is putting these steps into action as part of its "people-friendly" programs.

"There needs to be a 30 per cent increase in the number of trips to eliminate the issue of waitlisting in the passenger category - except during peak demand months - by the end of this decade," said Vaishnaw in December last year.

2024 Budget Highlights

GDP Growth Target: The government set a GDP growth target of 6.5% to 7% for FY 2024-25.

Fiscal Deficit: The fiscal deficit was targeted at 5.9% of GDP, down from 6.4% in the previous fiscal year.

Infrastructure Investment: The budget allocated ₹10 lakh crore for infrastructure projects, a 33% increase from the previous year.

Healthcare Allocation: The healthcare sector received an allocation of ₹2.5 lakh crore, marking a 15% increase from the previous budget.

Education Spending: Education was allocated ₹1.2 lakh crore, focusing on digital infrastructure and skill development.

Agricultural Credit: The agricultural credit target was set at ₹20 lakh crore to support farmers and boost rural development.

Direct Tax Revenue: The government projected a direct tax revenue collection of ₹18 lakh crore, with an emphasis on improving tax compliance.

Custom Duty Reduction: Reduction in custom duties on electronics, mobile phone parts, and certain other sectors to boost manufacturing, with rates cut by 5-10%.

Green Energy: Allocation of ₹35,000 crore for energy transition and net-zero objectives, with a focus on renewable energy.

Defense Spending: The defense budget was increased to ₹5.94 lakh crore, focusing on modernization and indigenization of defense equipment.


Economic Impact of the Big Fat Indian Wedding

Major Microsoft Service Failure Shuts Down Operations Worldwide



Recently, the world faced an issue with the Microsoft outage. A sudden chaos was seen across the globe as it affected everything, right from grounding flights, disrupting operations and crippling essential systems.

Microsoft said that a preliminary cause for the disruption was a configuration change "in a portion of its Azure backend workloads", which resulted in connectivity failures that affected Microsoft 365 services dependent on these connections. The outage revealed significant vulnerabilities and highlighted profound reliance on IT infrastructure.

Many airlines including American Airlines, Frontier Airlines, & Allegiant, as well as IndiGo airlines in India got affected due to this outage. It began Thursday evening and affected Microsoft's Central US region and crippled everything, right from booking, check-ins and other operational functions, which forced them to ground flights. Banking transactions paused and were kept on hold for several hours, thus impacting people with their valuable time and creating confusion and stress for everyone. Meanwhile, 911 operators were also facing major issues in coordinating with ambulance and police services. In the business world, crises can occur at any time. Hence, ensure your data and systems are secured and backed up. Comply with security policies to minimize the risks of breaches during outages and communicate effectively with customers if breaches occur during such crises.

THE 2024 WIMBLEDON CHAMPIONSHIPS



The 2024 Wimbledon Championships was a Grand Slam tennis tournament that took place at the All England Lawn Tennis and Croquet Club in Wimbledon, London, England, comprising singles, doubles and mixed doubles play. Junior, wheelchair and Invitational tournaments were also scheduled from July 1 to 14. It was the 137th edition of the Wimbledon Championships and the third Grand Slam event of 2024. The Gentlemen's singles event began on 1 July with the first of seven total rounds. Thirty-two players were seeded. Of those seeded players, eight were defeated in the first round, notably No. 6 Andrey Rublev, No. 17 Félix Auger-Aliassime, and No. 18 Sebastián Báez. Hubert Hurkacz, Casper Ruud and Stefanos Tsitsipas were the highest of the eighth seeded players to exit in the second round.

Further three seeded players were defeated in the third round, with them being No. 22 Alexander Bublik, No. 23 Alejandro Tabilo, and No. 29 Frances Tiafoe. Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard became the first lucky loser to reach the fourth round at Wimbledon since Dick Norman in 1995. Alexander Zverev, Grigor Dimitrov, Ben Shelton were the highest of the five seeded players who were defeated in the Round of 16. Further, in the women's single title, Barbora Krejčíková defeated Jasmine Paolini in the final. Djokovic and Alcaraz had met five times prior to the final, and with three wins to Alcaraz two in their meetups, Djokovic could have easily been the favorite.

Spain beat England in final of Euro 2024



With just under 20 minutes remaining, England pulled level. A quick breakaway saw Bukayo Saka race down the right, but Spain retreated well and several bodies seemed to block his path. His cutback found Jude Bellingham, and he instinctively laid the ball off for Cole Palmer, who coolly slotted home from the edge of the box. However, Spain went ahead again in the final five minutes of play. A cross round the back from Marc Cucurella found Mikel Oyarzabal, whose first-time finish beat Jordan Pickford. England so nearly drew level with their first attack after falling behind again. A Palmer corner was headed on by Declan Rice and saved by Unai Simon, Marc Guehi's rebound cleared off the line by Dani Olmo, and Rice's next attempt went wide. But that was as close as England came and Spain held on through four minutes of added time to be crowned champions of Europe for a record fourth time.

All three goals came in the second half and La Roja just about managed to prevail at the Olympiastadion in Berlin on Sunday. The first half yielded little in the way of chances, with England doing well to stifle Spain. Luke Shaw, drafted in for Kieran Trippier at left-back, managed to do a good job nullifying Lamine Yamal in particular. Rodri was withdrawn at half-time and that appeared to be a good omen for England, but Spain broke the deadlock shortly after the beginning of the second half. A well-worked move saw Yamal come inside and find fellow winger Nico Williams, who stroked the ball home at the far post.






